What Will You Learn?

Transition: You have the same rights in college as you did in high school, BUT there is a difference in how you go about getting them. You'll learn those differences at YLF.

Time Management: To survive college, you'll need to use time wisely and have good study skills. YLF provides key elements to make things easier for you and help you learn what rights are afforded to you.

Networking: You'll get exposed to networking with the other YLF students. You'll learn how they thrive despite their disabilities and trade ideas with one another.
