Leadership and Service Learning is a one-semester course which emphasizes the importance of leadership skills, volunteerism and professionalism in the development of personal qualities for students in grades 7-12 . Course Approval

School districts desiring to add Leadership and Service Learning to an existing program of study will need to provide training, curriculum, and equipment necessary for instruction. The course must be taught for five consecutive years after the initial implementation. A list of equipment and supplies may be obtained from the program manager.
